### What is Juneteenth?

On June 19, 1865, two-and-a-half years after the Emancipation Proclamation, enslaved people in Galveston, Texas finally learned they were free. The following year, Texans gathered to hold the first Jubilee Celebrations. Since then, June 19th has been a day of celebration to commemorate Black liberation.
